Achieves a big impact with a small footprint

Our school programmes are a cost-effective, high-impact education option that requires minimal school resources.

To deliver Project Can Do at your school, you simply need to do the following:

- Identify and enrol between 20 and 30 students in Year 10.
- Allocate one hour per week in your regular school timetable, for eight weeks.
- Provide us with a classroom large enough for up to 35 people, with a TV or Smart Board.
- Assign us a member of staff to be present during the workshops (they do not need to be actively involved in the session).
- Secure your programme booking with a £1,000 contribution towards the cost of the programme.

We can help you to identify suitable students and we're happy to deliver an assembly or presentation to the year group to generate interest. We achieve the greatest impact with students who need some extra support and encouragement to unlock their true potential.



We ask that the cohorts are diverse, and are made up of an even balance of genders if possible.

The sessions must be timetabled during the regular school day. We do not offer any sessions after school or during the holidays.

Tomorrow's Enterprise Foundation will provide a member of staff to deliver the workshops. We will manage all of the content and provide all of the learning materials.

All of our staff are enhanced DBS checked and are specially trained in classroom management and trauma-informed language and behaviour.



Connecting students to real businesses, real people, real case studies

We introduce inspirational local businesses into the classroom to bring the learning to life.

One of the most transformative and unique elements of our programme is our partnerships with organisations and business mentors from the local community.

The impact of our local partners ranges from providing one-off guest speaker sessions to playing a key role in shaping the content and delivery of the programme.

We aim to have at least five local organisations within our regional Enterprise Hubs, or one national organisation with a community presence in multiple UK regions.

These organisations are given the opportunity to provide us with real case studies or live projects to work on, as well as providing guest speakers and mentors.

The knowledge we gain from roundtable discussions within our Enterprise Hubs ensures that students are given up-to-date training and are learning place-based skills to give them the best chance of seeking out meaningful employment in their local communities.

- Increases self-confidence by spending time with senior staff members from local businesses.
